

Section 3.
All foundations must be built by and in accordance with the specifications of the cemetery at the expense of the lot owner.

Section 4.
No order for the constructions of a foundation may be acted on until specifications and certifications of payment for same have been received by the Sexton. No Guarantee of footer completion less than 90 days.

Section 5.
All monuments delivered to the cemetery must be handled by insured monument companies only. No stones can be handled by cemetery employees unless arrangements for same are made in advance with the cemetery sexton.

Section 6.
Mad River Township or its employees are not responsible for positioning of name on monument or marker.

**Article V
CONSTRUCTION WORK**

Section 1.
Monuments and construction material shall not be brought into the Cemetery until all preparatory work on the lot has been completed and further work shall proceed promptly.

**Article VI
LOTS AND GRAVE CARE**

Section 1. Regular Care.

The purchase price for your lot provides regular care which includes such services as scheduled grass mowing, trimming, tree and shrubbery trimming, seeding and fertilizing, and road maintenance. Owners cannot expect special or preferential treatment of their lots beyond such scheduled services.

All maintenance of graves, headstones and monuments will be performed by cemetery or authorized personnel.

Article I CEMETERY GENERAL POLICY

Section 1. General

- Mad River Cemeteries are maintained and operated as non-profit interment facilities.
- Are non-sectarian
- Cemeteries are closed sundown to sunup
- Cemetery is responsible only for markers and items installed to township specifications and approval per Ohio revised Code.

Section 2. Visitation.

- Cemetery grounds are sacredly devoted to the burial of the dead.
- No visitor is permitted to carry or use tools in cemetery, or do any work in the cemetery without the permission of the sexton
- All visitors vehicles shall remain on drives
- All debris, discarded flowers or decorations shall be placed in trash containers.
- Artificial flowers may be placed on graves between November 15 and March 15 ONLY!
- Visitor is not permitted to remove, cut deface or destroy cemetery property.
- Visitor may be asked to move their vehicle to another area if a burial service is expected.

Section 3. Internments.

- All interments in cemetery "grave space" facilities must be enclosed in a warranted reinforced concrete or steel vault.
- A representative of the funeral home will be required to remain at the cemetery until interment is completed.

Section 4. Lot Deed.

A lot holder may dispose of his/her holdings to a second party by sale or transfer with the notifications of the Sexton. Lots can be sold only for the original purchase price or less. It is against the law to sell holdings for a profit. (See Ohio Cemetery Laws).

Article II INTERMENTS

Section 1. Burials.

All remains can be permanently memorialized at Mad River Township Cemeteries by being deposited in an interment space in the earth. No stacking of remains will be permitted.

Section 2. Cremated Remains.

Cremated remains being in an urn may be buried in space in the earth, limit of eight (8) per grave site. A fee will be charged for additional remains in one grave space. Under no circumstances will the cemetery scatter human remains.

Article III DECORATIONS

Section 1.

Planting of flowers, flower pots, or bushy plants is strictly prohibited.

Section 2.

Cutting and trimming of grass is one of the largest and most costly maintenance activities of your cemetery. For economy of maintenance during growing season, NO flowers shall be placed on graves.

- Other than special holidays between March 15 and November 15 all decorations with the exception of Veterans flag staff holder shall not be placed in the ground or on the grass to allow for proper grave maintenance.
- All Floral decorations must be placed on the headstone or on an approved concrete slab, installed by cemetery personnel at lot owner's expense, and in an approved flower container.

Section 3.

The cemetery shall have the right to remove all floral designs, flower and other decoration of any kind from

the cemetery if, in the judgment of the Sexton, they do not conform to the standards set forth herein.

Section 4.

The placing on graves in the cemetery of boxes, shells, toys, metal designs, ornaments, chairs, vases, glass, plastic flowers or wires of any kind, wood or iron cases, glass and plastic blocks, artificial animals, tin cans, crockery, waste baskets, pails, cardboard cartons, metal rods for hanging baskets, candle light holders, statues and the like will not be permitted.

Section 5.

Decorations placed upon graves on special holidays during growing season: Easter, Mother's Day, Memorial Day, etc., will be removed after a period of FIVE days. If they are allowed to remain too long, they burn the grass.

Section 6.

Winter decorations, such as natural wreaths placed on easels, artificial arrangements and other approved arrangements will be permitted from November 15 to March 15 ONLY.

- Winter decorations will be removed when they become unsightly.
- All winter decorations will be removed March 15.

Article IV MONUMENTS

Section 1.

Markers or monuments must be on a foundation conforming to township specifications. No foot stones permitted except as a marker flush with the ground.

Section 2.

All monuments and markers must be constructed of granite from recognized quarry or of standard cast bronze of approved composition, all of which are guaranteed by responsible producer.
