

The Mad River Township Trustees met in regular session Monday April 2, 2012. Mr. Catanzaro called the meeting to order at 7:30 pm. Trustees McClure, Estep, and Catanzaro were in attendance, Fiscal Officer Leonard not present. The meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Trustee Estep motioned, seconded by Trustee Catanzaro to dispense the reading of the minutes. All Trustees voting yes.

Reports:

Chief Leist attended a dam meeting with Soil and Water to develop an emergency action plan in the event of a break in a private dam. In regards to the tornado siren placement, Chief Leist met with the Miller and Smith families; both were satisfied with the placement that was established.

Don O'Connor – the Ginger Dr. estimate from the engineer's office was the same as last year. They cut trees on Jackson Road, worked with the County for estimate salt sweeping. They did some cold patching and the cemetery and park have been mowed.

Deputy Wagoner – reported that the two young men, who were part of a chase through Enon and were suspects in the burglaries of township residences, were out on bond and talking about robbing residents again. He said to be on the lookout for a maroon van. Bob added that residents should call 911 if they see any suspicious activity in their neighborhoods.

Old Business –

First reading of the parking ban resolution on Dayton Springfield Rd. between the Greene County line and Springfield Township, excluding the incorporated area of the Village of Enon. Trustee Kathy Estep said the resolution would prohibit parking on both sides of the county road, and violation of the resolution would result in a \$100 fine. Estep noted that any vehicle found parked in the delineated section of roadway would be subject to impoundment or immobilization.

New Business: None

Audience: Mr. Miller stated he was satisfied with the placement of the tornado siren on his property.

There was a question from the audience in regards to the township roads. The Trustees did do their annual inspection of the Roads.
