Don O'Connor – Ditch job in Lindair is done. They checked it out today to look for settling and both homeowners involved are happy. The mower is down. Patching is being worked on. Mowing and weed eating in cemetery. Working on foundations in the cemetery. Grasshopper is down. A little welding will repair it.

Trustee McClure asked if they trimmed the brush on Garrison. They did a nice job and it looks a lot better. Trustee Catanzaro was up in Lindair and said the crew did an excellent job on it. The homeowner called him and was very pleased.

Trustee Catanzaro asked Don and his crew to go over and fill in some patches at the Hustead Firehouse.

Deputy Wise – Greenon was evacuated today. A student received a text message about a possible bomb threat at the school. It was evacuated and swept. An arrest has already been made.
