

**MAD RIVER TOWNSHIP
SEPTEMBER 19, 2005**

The Trustees of Mad River Township meet in regular session with Robert Mc Clure, Kathy Estep, and Richard Schumann, Trustees, Debra Maurer, Deputy Clerk present. Motion by Mrs. Estep, 2nd Mr. Schumann to approve the minutes of meeting held 09-5-05 as presented. All Trustees present voting aye.

Chief Leist noted that the department is NIMS compliant. The department is on standby for hurricane relief. The Chief has purchased three sets of used fire equipment and six helmets at a cost of \$2,200.

Chief Young reported that the radio tower will be installed starting tomorrow. The date to auction off the old buildings will be set at a later date.

Howard White with the Township Planning Committee explained the revisions to the Township Comprehensive Land use Plan.

Deputy Wagner informed Trustees that the situation in Snyderville seems to be improving. West Enon and Ashbrook Estates would like to start a neighborhood crime watch program. Deputy Wagner reported that the hand held radar units are in.

Under old business Mrs. Estep presented a resolution lowering the speed limit of the following streets to 25 mph, seconded by Mr. Schumann. All Trustees present voting aye.

Mrs. Estep moved to revise the Township Comprehensive Land use Plan to the September 2005 version, seconded by Mr. Schumann. All Trustees present voting aye.

Mr. Schumann voted to accept Springfield Fence Company's estimate of \$950 for fencing with gates for residents neighboring the Holiday Valley Park, seconded by Mrs. Estep. All Trustees present voting aye.

During new business Mrs. Estep and Mr. Schumann were recognized for attending a leadership workshop in Washington, D.C.

There will be a zoning meeting September 21 at 7:30. It was reported that White Oaks is planning to ask for 150 acres to be rezoned. The development is expecting to have 251

homes. The PUD will be served by water & sewer in a conservation style development with 45% green space. The Trustees will send a letter indicating approval.

Chief Young requested clearing back the brush at the bike path intersections.

Truck traffic is a problem on Arthur Road. The County Engineer will be consulted.

A list of bills presented and warrants issued for same appear at the end of the minutes. There being no further business motion to adjourn by Mrs. Estep, 2nd Mr. Schumann. All Trustees present voting aye.
