A RESOLUTION TO ADOPT TOWNSHIP PARKING REGULATIONS; AND
FOR THE REPEAL OF ALL EARLIER VERSIONS OF MAD RIVER
TOWNSHIP PARKING REGULATIONS, PURSUANT TO OHIO REVISED
CODE SECTION 505.17

Trustee *Jay Young* moved the adoption of the following resolution:

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of Mad River Township is authorized by Section 505.17 of the Revised Code to adopt such parking regulations as are necessary for the safety of the residents of Mad River Township;

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Board of Trustees, with at least two-thirds of its members elected thereto concurring, that the Mad River Township Parking Regulations, a copy of which are attached to this resolution and incorporated herein, are adopted for all roads and streets in Mad River Township, except in those portions of Mad River Township within the limits of a municipal corporation.

Be It Further Resolved, that said Parking Regulations shall be effective in Mad River Township on April 21, 2023.

Be It Further Resolved, that all earlier versions of Mad River Township Parking Regulations are repealed, effective April 21, 2023


Be It Further Resolved, that the Mad River Township Fiscal Officer is directed to cause the Mad River Township Parking Regulations to be posted in five conspicuous places in Mad River Township for thirty days prior to April 21, 2023, and to be published in a newspaper of general circulation in Mad River Township or three consecutive weeks.

Mad River Township Parking Regulations:

Regulation Number 2023 - 005

Date: March 20, 2023

Be it resolved, that the Board of Township Trustees of Mad River Township, Clark County, Ohio, for the safety of the residents of the Township and in order to implement the orderly policing and control of parking of motor vehicles on the streets and roadways of the Township, do hereby adopt the following regulations under the authority of section 505.17 of the Ohio Revised Code. All earlier versions of the Mad River Township parking regulations are hereby repealed, effective April 21, 2023.

Section 1.01

Parking Areas Covered By Regulations

The following regulations concerning parking on Township roads and streets shall be effective on April 21, 2023 and shall apply to all Township roads and streets other than those located within the Village of Enon.

Section 1.02

Definitions

- (A) "Vehicle" means every device, including a motorized bicycle and an electric bicycle, in, upon, or by which any person or property may be transported or drawn upon a highway, except that "vehicle" does not include any motorized wheelchair, any electric personal assistive mobility device, any low-speed micromobility device, any personal delivery device as defined in section 4511.513 of the Revised Code, any device that is moved by power collected from overhead electric trolley wires or that is used exclusively upon stationary rails or tracks, or any device, other than a bicycle, that is moved by human power.
- (B) "Person" means every natural person, firm, co-partnership, association, or corporation.
- (C) "Crosswalk" means: (1) That part of a roadway at intersections ordinarily included within the real or projected prolongation of property lines and curb lines or, in the absence of curbs, the edges of the traversable roadway; (2) Any portion of a roadway at an intersection or elsewhere, distinctly indicated for pedestrian crossing by lines or other markings on the surface; (3) Notwithstanding divisions (C)(1) and (2) of this section, there shall not be a crosswalk where local authorities have placed signs indicating no crossing.
- (D) "Residence district" means the territory, not comprising a business district, fronting on a street or highway, including the street or highway, where, for a distance of three hundred feet or more, the frontage is improved with residences or residences and buildings in use for business.
- (E) "Park" means the standing of a vehicle, whether occupied or not.

(F) "Roadway" means that portion of a highway improved, designed, or ordinarily used for vehicular travel, except the berm or shoulder. If a highway includes two or more separate roadways the term "roadway" means any such roadway separately but not all such roadways collectively.

(G) "Sidewalk" means that portion of a street between the curb lines, or the lateral lines of a roadway, and the adjacent property lines intended for the use of pedestrians.

(H) "Junk or Inoperable Vehicle" A vehicle which is: (1) three years old, or older, (2) apparently inoperable, and (3) extensively damaged, including, but not limited to, any of the following: missing wheels, tires, engine, or transmission.

(J) "Other Definitions" any definitions not found within this regulation shall be the same as those that are found within the O.R.C Ohio Motor Vehicle Laws: (R.C. 4511.01)

Section 1.03 Prohibited, Standing or Parking Places

No person shall stand or park a vehicle, except when necessary to avoid conflict with other traffic or to comply with provisions of these regulations, while obeying the directions of a police officer or a traffic control device, in any of the following places:

- (A) On a sidewalk, curb, or street lawn area, except a bicycle;
- (B) In front of a public or private driveway;
- (C) Within an intersection;
- (D) Within ten feet of a fire hydrant;
- (E) On a crosswalk;
- (F) Within twenty feet of a crosswalk at an intersection;
- (G) Within thirty feet of, and upon the approach to, any flashing beacon, stop sign, or traffic control device;
- (H) Between a safety zone and the adjacent curb or within thirty feet of points on the curb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone, unless a different length is indicated by a traffic control device;
- (I) Within fifty feet of the nearest rail of a railroad crossing;

(J) Within twenty feet of a driveway entrance to any fire station and, on the side of the street opposite the entrance to any fire station, within seventy-five feet of the entrance when it is properly posted with signs;

(K) Alongside or opposite any street excavation or obstruction when such standing or parking would obstruct traffic;

(L) Alongside any vehicle stopped or parked at the edge or curb of a street;

(M) Upon any bridge or elevated structure upon a highway, or within a highway tunnel;

(N) At any place where signs prohibit stopping;

(O) Within one foot of another parked vehicle;

(P) On the roadway portion of a street, freeway, expressway, or thruway improved, designed or ordinarily used for vehicular travel Parking or standing shall be permitted on Township streets or highways only when sufficient space is provided at the curb or shoulder of the street or highway which will permit a motor vehicle to be parked without interfering in any way with the normal flow of vehicular traffic on the roadway. (R.C. 4511.68)

Section 1.04 Parking Near Curb.

(A) Every vehicle stopped or parked upon a roadway where there is an adjacent curb shall be stopped or parked with the right-hand wheels of the vehicle parallel with and not more than twelve inches from the right-hand curb, unless it is impossible to approach so close to the curb; in such case the stop shall be made as close to the curb as possible and only for the time necessary to discharge and receive passengers or to load or unload merchandise

(B) No vehicle shall be stopped or parked on a road or highway with the vehicle facing in a direction other than the direction of travel on that side of the road or highway. (R.C. 4511.69)

Section 1.05 Repairing Vehicles Upon the Roadway

No person shall stop, stand and/or park a vehicle upon any roadway for the principal purpose of any of the following: greasing or repairing such vehicle except repairs necessitated by an emergency.

Section 1.06
Maximum Forty-Eight Hour Parking

No owner and/or operator of a motor vehicle shall park any vehicle on any of the public streets or highways within the Township for a continuous period of more than forty-eight hours. (R.C. 4511.69)

Section 1.07
Prohibited Parking of Commercial and Recreational Vehicles In Residential Districts

No person shall park any of the following vehicles on any residential streets with-in the Township: bus, school bus, recreational vehicle, commercial tractor, agricultural tractor, trailer, semi-trailer; pull trailer, moving van, boat, boat trailer, homemade trailer and truck with a capacity of one ton. Except in an emergency necessitating repairs or to load or unload any materials or merchandise, However, for the loading or unloading of materials or merchandise, parking shall be authorized not to exceed one hour. (R.C. 4511.69)

Section 1.08
Failure To Display Valid License Plates

No person shall park any motor vehicle as defined in this regulation on any Township road if said vehicle does not bear a valid and/or current license plate. (R.C. 4503.21)

Section 1.09
Prohibited Parking of Junk or Inoperable Vehicles

No person shall park any junk or inoperable motor vehicle as defined in this regulation on any Township Roadway. (R.C. 4513.64)

Section 1.10
Penalty

- (A) Whoever violates any parking regulation is guilty of a minor misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than one hundred dollars.
- (B) Each day of continued violation of any parking regulation shall constitute a separate offense


